

Notice Success Report- Nullified California SB-1160

Details of Notice:

- **Notice Subject:** SB-1160 Nullification – The bill is null and void as it attempts to convert the fundamental liberty interest of owning arms into a license, violating the guaranteed right to bear arms. The people affirm that the rights declared in the Bills and Declarations of Rights are excepted out of the general powers of government.
- **Date Introduced:** February 14, 2024
- **Sent to:** California Senate
- **Sent on:** March 10, 2024 – April 6, 2024
- **Number of Notices Sent:** 118
- **Instructions Given:** Nullify SB-1160 and cease introducing any further pretended acts of legislation that violate oaths of office, are repugnant to the Constitution, and interfere with the fundamental liberty interest of self-defense.

Response:

- **Action Taken by Recipient:** Placed on APPR suspense file for further review.
- **Action Date:** May 6, 2024
- **Compliance Status:** Compliant

Outcome:

- **Result of Action:** Bill was held in committee and under submission.
- **Impact on Operations:** The bill did not move forward in the legislative process after being reviewed by the Appropriations Committee, meaning it has stalled indefinitely.

Additional Comments:

The placement of SB-1160 in the APPR suspense file and its ultimate holding in committee ensured that the bill did not progress, protecting the right to bear arms from further legislative interference.

Current Action



**Lawful Notification to the State of California State
Legislature of Corrective Maladministration of Operations,
and**

DEFEATED

Tell the California State Legislature that the right to bear arms is outside the general powers of government and that SB-1160 is unlawful. Any attempt to convert the right to bear arms into a license is void and a violation of their oaths.
